

JAGUAR XK8 1996 - 2006

The creation of a successor to the 'E-Type' exercised minds at Jaguar for the best part of 30 years before the XK8 was finally given the go-ahead in 1992. There was a Pininfarina XJS in the 1970's and the 'F' Type (code named Project 41) prototypes running when Ford brought Jaguar, but they were overweight and inappropriate for the 1990's. Studies were carried out at Ghia in Turin and Ford's own design office in Dearborn, USA, but the one to succeed was a Jaguar design from Coventry (project X100), the work of a team lead by Geoff Lawson and Keith Helfet. It was based around the Jaguar designed 4-cam 32 valve 4.0-litre V8 AJ-V8 engine built at a new Ford plant in Bridgend in South Wales, with an XJS platform, albeit modified, itself a descendent of the key car in Jaguar's history, the XJ6 of 1968.




By the time the XK8 appeared in October 1996, under the direction of Styling Manager Fergus Pollock, Project Director Bob Dover and 250 Jaguar engineers, it was already assured of a classic status. The XK8 had a design brief without parallel in the history of the motor industry. The market expected something conservative, not too trendy. It anticipated a car that would pay homage to the 'C-Type', 'D-Type' and 'E-Type' without appearing too retrospective or obsequious, a car that would embody the essence of a Le Mans winner with the spirit of a grand tourer. The XK8 was preceded by the Aston Martin DB7 with a

supercharged 6 cylinder AJ16-derived engine and it had to appear longer yet distinctive. There was

little cross-referencing or confusion. Above all the XK8 reflected traditional Jaguar values and had to reach the top end of the JD Power owner satisfaction surveys in the United States.

Changed days! Where once the chief requirement of a Jaguar engine had merely been to satisfy the customer on speed, power, appearance, economy, efficiency and making the right noises, now it had to meet a whole raft of world-wide regulations on emission strictures. Yet it still had to satisfy the customers.

Jaguar's engineering director, Clive Ennos, convinced Ford that Jaguar had to have its own engine. A modular derivative from one of Ford's
