JAGUAR XJ6/12 2-door Coupe 1973 - 1977

There was something of a hiatus between the announcement of what became a Jaguar classic, the 2 door XJ and the start of serious production. When it was introduced to the press in the Summer of 1973, Jaguar explained that the examples shown were prototypes and no more would be made until the



following year. In the event it was the spring of 1975 before any went on sale and the model remained in production for only two years. A total of 6,505 XJ6C's and 1,873 XJ12C's were made before it was discontinued, pending the introduction of the XJ-S. Part of the delay was due to difficulties in engineering a pillarless 2-door. Reinforcement was built into the rear quarters, because the roof and B-post (the central pillar), played a key role in the car's strength. There were difficulties with the rear-most side window, which tended to be drawn out into the slipstream at a critical point of low pressure, creating

wind-noise. The fact of the manner was that the management took a short term view, regarding the coupe as something of a distraction from the preoccupation with saloons and did not accord it a very high priority.


The 2 door Jaguar was never officially known as a Coupe but the "C" suffix ensured its adoption. The roof was covered in a smart black vinyl, a fashionable adomment which also served to disguise the thickness of the 'C' post (the rear pillar), necessary to meet roll-over safety regulations as well as to ensure body stiffness comparable with the 4-door car. The result was one of the best looking of all XJ series. Mounted on what was to be known as the short wheelbase, the proportions of the car were striking and the vinyl gave it the "hardtop convertible" appearance, not only popular in America where it was created, but anywhere elegant cars were appreciated. A 2-door car is



seldom as practical as a 4-door and access to the rear seats of the coupe Jaguar was not easy. Despite the bolstering of the "C-post", the 2-door cars were some 50lbs lighter than thier 4-door counterparts, although the Series II cars, like almost every Jaguar, did put on weight over the 'Series I' on the account of the increased burden of safety regulations, heavier bumpers and equipment such as electric windows fitted as standard.
