







TA TA TO HIGH VALUES?

Resale values for Jaguar and Land-Rover models could be heading for the rocks if Indian firm Tata is successful in its bid to buy the two companies, according to a prominent trade price guide.

Ford want to offload its pair of premium British brands. The move could spell disaster for residuals, claim the experts at Vehicle Information Publishing responsible for the "Trader Guide".

Director Martin Keighley was quoted as saying, "In the short term, there will be uncertainty over prices, but the handover needs to be well managed or it could be a total disaster in terms of residual values." While Tata is a widely respected firm globally (for those that don't already know, apart from making cheap cars, they also own Tetley Tea and Corus Steel) he explained its budget heritage in the UK could cause problems. "At the premium level, the used car market is all about people's perceptions of the marque." He went on, "If you ask the man in the street, he will say Tata is a poor brand, with poor im age and poor products. Part of the reason the Mini does so well is because everyone knows it is owned by BMW and if another premium brand was to buy Jaguar and Land Rover, this wouldn't even be an issue." However, forecast manager of "CAP Monitor", Jeff Knight disagreed, "Would people even know the company have changed hands?" he asked, "For many buyers, their experience of a brand begins and ends at the local dealer." I am not so sure. Will cheap parts start to find there way into current Jaguars and cause reliability problems? The word is that Tata will not change anything, but I have been around companies that have been taken over and the same was said. Once the company has its foot in the door, changes begin to creep in and people moved out!! We will see, will it be Ta Ta Jaguar???????? Editor

JAGUAR 420G 1966 -1970

While the Mark X gained the 4.2 litre engine, it also inherited the all-synchromesh gearbox, an alternator replaced the dynamo and a pre-engaged starter not only helped cold starting but made the process quieter and more refined. The 4.2 Mark X was the first car to use Varamatic, the trade name for a variable-ratio power steering, which subsequently set the pattern for almost all PAS systems. Jaguars' had been a bit lifeless, particularly the Mark X's, but the Varamatic



constantly altered the ratio from 4½ turns

near the straight ahead position to 2 turns as it approached full lock, which felt better and improved its accuracy. Almost alone among Jaguars, the Mark X never suffered from the over-adornment which had been used to distinguish later editions. It was available with a limousine division, anticipating the later use of its floorpan for the magnificent Daimler Limousine and in 1966 changed its name from the Mark X to the 420G. This seems to have been prompted by America; the 420G came from the engine size, the 'G' evidently meant 'Grand' and was added to

segregate it from the S-class variant known simply as the 420. Sales marginally improved, helped by the

fact that the car's replacement, the XJ6, wasn't announced until Sept., 1968 and even then, stocks remained in short supply well into 1969, allowing production of the 420G to continue into 1970. Never considered to be one of Jaguars' better designs, the Mark X did carry its style and proportions well and was an immensely strong car overall. Many would say it was the last of the traditional Jaguars, with chrome on brass window frames and some traditional touches, characteristic of previous models. In total only just over 25,000 Mark X/420G models were produced from 1961 to 1970, pro rata the lowest production figure per year of any Jaguar saloon style ever.
