

RUST PREVENTION USING WAXOYL

My 2002 2.5 AWD Jaguar X-Type will be 10 years old next year and due to the ridiculous prices that one can expect in part exchange, I decided that as the car has been very good since I purchased it in 2005 and there are no signs of any oil leaks or rust, it would be better for me to keep the car. It has been regularly serviced by a Jaguar franchised dealer and nothing needs doing to it. I had heard of issues relating to the inner seals rotting behind the



plastic covers that run beneath the doors from the front to the rear wheels and thought it may be advisable to think about having the whole car Waxoyled. After 'surfing the web' I came up with a company called JR Classics Ltd of Askern, Nr. Doncaster, South Yorkshire, who specialise in

this work. Their web site told me all I needed to know and following a brief e-mail to Nigel Thorley at the JEC, who had heard of the company, I



contacted the owner, Joe Ratcliffe. His rates are very reasonable and indicated on the web site and an agreed figure of £350 was confirmed.

Following a deposit of £50, a date was fixed for me to take the car to him on Monday 19th September. He indicated that he would need the car for two days and I made arrangements to stay in the locality – Travel Lodge Special @ £19:00 per night!! Joe Ratcliffe has had the company for 5 years. He used to occupy another unit but



he was regularly requested to undertake the treatment on motor homes, and they were too tall for his old premises. Therefore, three years ago, he obtained the lease on his current premises which has a roof height of over 30 foot, which is no longer a problem for any vehicle. He undertakes rust preventive treatment on a lot of 4 x 4 vehicles - in particular Land Rover's - as well as imports, modern, classics and vintage vehicles. His next vehicle to be treated is in fact a 6 month old Land Rover. Joe indicated that he was surprised with the poor protection on some of the Land Rover models, particularly the Disco's and Freelander's have, yet both are built for off road use. One wonders whether this is because 90% are used as 'Chelsea Tractors' perhaps. Joe means of getting under the car is to use a 'Mobi lift'

which raises the car at an angle rather than work under the car or ramp and have a neck ache. Joe said that it is far easier to work with the car at angle.

The Waxoyl product is wet to start, then when the thinners evaporate, it leaves a semi-solidified solution which spreads to all areas inside body panels. The products Joe uses are Hammerite Waxoyl, Dynax, Dinitrol or Silver

Hook (which doesn't have rust killing properties.) Dynax is twice the price of Dinitrol. Dinitrol is about £60 more than Waxovl on a medium size cars. Hammerite Underbody Seal Schutz with added Waxoyl is used for underneath the car. All areas of the underside will need to be cleaned by wire brush to remove all surface rust so that the Waxoyl adheres to the surface. All inner door cavities need to be covered with Waxoyl and in order to do this a probe needs to be inserted in via the electrical cable holes that already exists in the side of the doors. The probe has a 360 degree head so after inserting the probe as far in as possible, when withdrawing it, the Waxovl is spread all around the inside cavity of the door skin.





The other option would be to remove the door trims, but if on an older car, the trims may be warped or have been on and off too many times and this could make it difficult to refit following the treatment. The initial option was the one taken on my car. After checking all along the seams for signs of rust, particularly at the bottom of the door skins, the works commenced with spraying the inside of all doors. Also, the box section inside the front foot wells. The next stage was to inject areas under bonnet and the engine bay. The front wings were next. Once this was done, the plastic cover on this inside of the boot lip and the side panels were removed and the spraying undertaken. Then the boot lid cover was removed and the sections are sprayed. It was noted the



inner boot lid area was not factory treated. The area within the boot lid is susceptible to moisture and dirt, which in time could cause corrosion. How many cars have you seen with corrosion on the boot lid, particularly on the




lip? All inner cavities above the rear wheel arches are sprayed. Various nozzles used to ensure all areas are covered. Various times throughout the process areas are cleaned down where the oily substance has run down i.e. bottom of the doors, etc. The next stage is underneath. The car is put upon its side using the 'Mobi lift'. The mud flaps are removed – with difficulty due to the corrosion on the bolts – from each four corners, then the inner plastic guards to expose the metal, surrounding the wheel housing. The brake discs are covered in plastic to protect them, before sanding of the inner area is undertaken. All surface rust is removed. Overall the car is very good for its age. There is not a lot to clean and the underside of the foot wells still have two layers of factory protection on. A further layer of Waxoyl will only ensure the car has maximum protection on the

underside to protect it from the elements –particularly the salt in the winter months. Then followed a masking of the exposed sides of the car and exhaust and tailpipes. Areas of exposed metal were wire brushed, then sprayed with an industrial Hycote zinc paint. Like most vehicles, nothing is easy and one or two bolts, holding on panels, were rusted on tight and Joe used various methods to remove them and eventually succeeded. Preparation is the key to the work rather than just covering the underside with the treatment. Joe made sure all exposed areas of metalwork were free from surface rust, either by using the electric wire brush or using a hand operated wire brush for the restricted areas. The final stage is the treatment. All access holes under the car where inserted with the probe and the Waxoyl sprayed using the 360 degree nozzle. Then finally all areas under the car were sprayed with the black coloured Hammerite Underbody Seal Schutz with the added Waxoyl.

Job done!!!

The length of time the treatment will last is totally dependent on the use of the vehicle. A certificate of Rustproofing Treatment is issued on completion of the work.

Yearly check-ups needed to ensure all areas are OK and no damage to the covering has occurred. It will be needed for about 1.5 hrs.
