


CLUB NIGHTS

Having watched the weather forecasts all week, the indications was that the event would be a wet day. However, at 6am on the day, I again checked and found that in fact it was going to be dry up until 4pm. The forecasters were almost right, it was 4:30pm when it started raining. Therefore the whole day was in fact dry, cold, but dry.

We started the day at The Grasshopper Inn, Westerham, which dates back to the 13th century and according to old newspaper cuttings, it was the centre of the village's social life. Originally there were two cottages huddled together behind a dusty cart track. One of the small cottages was used as a beer house called 'The Plough'. Having been here once before, it was good to see that they had opened it up for us to eat our bacon roll and drink our coffee/tea inside in the warm, as before, it was supplied outdoors. Many of our club members participated this year as can be seen in some of the photos here. This event needs a co-pilot to navigate the way around the route as well as

year Jackie and I got them all right, but so did others on the hunt. Therefore, it was a case
of all winning answer sheets were put in a basket and pulled out one by one. Neither
Jackie or myself are lucky when it comes to something like this!!! No champagne for us!!!
I do hope that all the members that participated enjoyed the day but now having
undertaken the last 7 years, I wish to make the following observations and would welcome
feedback from others that attended on 22nd April. I have been in touch with Phil Weedon
of Jaguar World (he was the guy who caught you out when you arrived in Brighton at the
finishing line!) who welcomes feedback to improve the event. Here are my concerns;

- 1. We used to have two stops on route to Brighton and in recent years these have been reduced to one.
- 2. The title is called the London to Brighton Run, yet we have started on various occasions in the wilds of Kent.
- 3. We have in the past had tea/coffee and bacon roll for the start and in the 7 years that I have been undertaking the run we have always had a tea/coffee and cake at the first stop. We had nothing this year after leaving Westerham.
- 4. The price increased this year yet we had a sponsors, Arun Motors so we feel short changed.
- 5. And finally, the "Official Photographer" is a joke. He has increased prices in recent years from £5 to £8 for a standard 6 x 4 picture but the finished product is far from being professional. My own picture had half the finish banner missing and when I took it up with him it was a case of take it or leave it my choice! To give you an example, I have just had a two photos blown up to 9 x 6 on a Jessops web site. Cost just 55p each. They too are making profits on this price. How therefore can the "official photographer" charge £8 a picture? Even with waste (those that haven't purchased a photo) I cannot see how he can justify these prices. He has a monopoly that should be curtailed. Obviously with regards to the route chosen, you can only go so far in varying it and I applaud the organisers for their efforts in finding new ways to Brighton and venues to visit! However, there must come a time when you have to turn full circle and start again; I know some of the participants would love to return to some of the previous attractions. Now is that time.

I wrote to Phil Weedon of Jaguar World with my concerns and here is his reply;

Thanks for the feedback. There's no way of improving the event if we don't get such response.

I can't answer all aspects, but here goes:

There was coffee and bacon at the start – but I understand that the Grasshopper ran out so some late arrivals missed out. We will of course discuss this with them

I'm not sure about the decision regarding one vs two stops, but I know there was a view expressed by some that two stops extended the time it took to Brighton and many people preferred to get down to Brighton sooner to enjoy the seaside. There is also of course an element of simplifying the route London start points are always tricky – availability is tough, the prices of booking such venues often prohibitive and then there's the logistics of getting 300 cars in and out of a London venue, when the roads do not always lend themselves to it. Add to the fact that the London Marathon is on the same weekend and it's been deemed easier to stage a more scenic start point even if it does stretch the 'London' bit.

I was not aware of the arrangement for the official photographer but obviously again we can look into that. There is of course no obligation to buy these

I know it's unfortunate that cost of the run has risen over the years, but given that petrol (for the recce), paper, print and other consumables have all risen in cost, we inevitably have to pass at least some of that on in the form of the entry price.

I'll pass on this email to Lynne, who organises the event and we will obviously try and take this on board for next year's L2B. It remains a hugely popular event and a great way of enjoying your Jaguar so we're keen to maintain its presence in the motoring calendar for many years to come.


