

# SAD DEATH OF ANDY CHAPMAN AGED 48

I have to report the sad death of Andy Chapman, who passed away on Thursday 30<sup>th</sup> August. Andy was a keen member of the Jaguar Enthusiasts' Club and was considering taking up car racing again, something he had done in the past and which was one of his great passions, along with Jaguar vehicles and clay pigeon shooting. Initially, Andy, who grew up in Upminster, was told that he had an inflamed liver, but the situation took a dramatic turn for the worse when a week later he was diagnosed with bowel cancer, which had spread to his intestines, liver and the bottom of his lungs. Although medical staff thought he had a good chance of recovery, he reacted badly to the first chemotherapy session and began deteriorating quickly. Andy, who lived in West Hanningfield, was transferred from Springfield Hospital to Farleigh's Hospice, in Chelmsford and where he passed away. The club was represented by Doug Warren at his funeral, which was on Wednesday 12<sup>th</sup> September at Chelmsford Crematorium. Our thoughts and prayers go out to his wife Julie and his two boys, Dan and Steve.

# SAD DEATH OF EDDIE FARMER AGED 72

I have to again sadly report the death of another club member, Eddie Farmer. Eddie who had been a member of Essex Thameside Region since the early 90's lived initially in the Romford area before moving to Harwich. He joined the local club there - Essex & Suffolk Borders - but continued to support Essex Thameside with his membership renewal, as well as the occasional appearance at our shows. I am glad to say that I last saw Eddie at the Helmingham Car Show in August. He was obviously a different man to when I last saw him due to his illness. He too was suffering with cancer. 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# X-TYPE 10 YEAR SERVICE

What gets done?

In the past seven years of ownership, I have always taken my 2002 X-Type 2.5SE AWD to Lookers (formally Dovercourts) in Chelmsford, a Ford garage that was an approved Jaguar Service Centre too. At the beginning of 2012, due to various reasons, they lost their Jaguar franchise. However, I can assure you that this was not because of their poor service on Jaguars as they always undertook an excellent job on my car. The franchise was then awarded to Lookers Land Rover in Cuton Hall Lane, Chelmsford. This year, is the tenth anniversary of my car and as such required more than just a service. Although I have only covered 63,000 miles, after 10 years Jaguar recommend the automatic gearbox oil is changed. When new, the car was sold with the indication that the 5 speed Jatco automatic gearbox was sealed for life and there-



fore "maintenance free". It is only when you achieve 100,000 miles or the 10 year milestone that Jaguar recommend changing the gearbox oil. The auto transmission fluid recommended is AF48 specification at £24 per litre. 8.8 litres are required but in truth, I understand when draining the gearbox, the most one can expect to refill is around 5 - 6 litres.



So, on Thursday 20<sup>th</sup> September at 8am I visited Lookers Jaguar /Land Rover. First up, the car was to have an MOT. Having covered just 2,800 miles since the last MOT, I was hopeful that it would sail through. No such luck! I had experienced problems with the bonnet release for a number of years and normally just gave it a squirt of WD40 now and again. I hadn't done it for a few months and as a consequence, when the technician went to shut the bonnet it failed to close properly. This issue was subsequently rectified during the service that took place after the MOT.

The car was returned to the service bay where I watched as technician Glynn Abbott, undertook the service of my Jaguar. Glynn has worked for the Lookers Group since 1990. He had undertaken the required level of training on Jaguars at Castle Bromwich. He indicated to me that the gearbox was similar to the one used on the Land Rover Freelander, which as it happens requires a gearbox oil change at 60,000 miles. So Glyn started the service with the lights, ensuring all were working correctly. Then the handbrake to ensure that this was OK. It was. He then checked the door hinges, boot hinges and lubricated them. He then checked the condition of the wiper blades. All OK. Tyre pressures, tyre depths and tyre conditions were all inspected, including the spare. Now, this is when he began to use a device like an iPad which has all the necessary items required relating to the service and has various drop down menus with specific details, ie. it lists all the tyre sizes and the required pressures. For whatever reason, the device only showed 16" and 17" tyres with a variety of tyre widths. The 18" which I had fitted, which were available as an optional ex-

tra, was not listed. I therefore helped Glynn with the pressure that I regularly use for these tyres; 40 psi front, 38 psi rear. Then the brake pads were inspected to ensure there was plenty of pad left. There was. Next the bodywork was checked for damage. There wasn't any! He then checked the torque of all the wheel nuts.


Glynn's next 'port of call' was the engine sump. He removed the sump bolt and drained the oil into a container. The drain plug is disposed of and a new replacement fitted. The oil filter is also removed and replaced with a new filter and then the new oil added.





Next was the various checks on windscreen washer fluid, coolant levels, power steering levels, battery electrolyte, drive belt and auto-tensioner inspection. Glynn then went onto the gearbox. I was under the impression that as the box was a "sealed for life" unit, there was no drain plug. Not so, as this photo on the right proves.

The drain plug was removed and the gearbox oil flowed out. The oil was in fact quite red after being in the gearbox for 10 years. While the oil was draining out of the gearbox, Glynn then changed the brake fluid using a pressurised system



which forced the old fluid out of each bleed screw on the four brake calipers around the car. He then refilled the slave cylinder with new brake fluid. Next, it was back to the auto gearbox. The procedure was: 'After draining out the old oil, and no more seen to drip out, a new drain plug is to be fitted, tightened to 45Nm. Lower the vehicle and remove the automatic transmission fluid charging pipe cap'. The charging pipe cap was well down in the engine



bay. Glynn had to improvise with bits of pipe and a metal pump in order to refill the gearbox as this photo shows. Once filled, he raised the vehicle again and made sure the J-Gate shift selector was in the park position. With the engine running and the foot brake applied, he moved the J-Gate shift selector through "P-R-N-4-3-2" and back to "P" position to circulate the automatic transmission fluid until the temperature reached between 30 -40 degrees as per the recommended Jaguar instructions. When the automatic transmission fluid reached 35 degrees and with the engine running, he removed the automatic transmission fluid level tube plug. Gearbox oil flowed out of the fluid level plug hole and was then discarded. He then refitted a new plug and sealing washer, which was tightened to 15Nm.

Next, various pipe joints under the car were greased. Glynn then checked the antifreeze resistance with a probe, -38 degrees - that will do nicely!! Don't think it will get that cold here in the UK. And finally, a pollen filter was fitted to the nearside unit, under the bottom windshield plastic cover. All done, now the road test and paperwork.

It was then a return to the customers' waiting area while the final paperwork was completed. Various coffees are available to customers, along with canned drinks, bottled water and the daily paper, big screen TV and sales literature. Also to note was copies of the Jaguar Enthusiasts' Magazine which I now supply to the dealership. Quite a change from my previous Ford dealership. I must say that it was a welcome change.



Lookers Land Rover have only been undertaking Jaguar servicing for a very short time and hope to build on its Range Rover reputation by providing better service to Jaguar owners. So if you have a Jaguar and live in the mid Essex area, get in touch with either Gary McKay - Senior Service Advisor, or Ben Smith - Service Advisor and arrange a service of your Jaguar.

Since the gearbox oil has been replaced, I have found the gear changes smoother than previously. I had certain reservations about having the oil changed in the gearbox as my feeling were that if its not broken, don't fix it. My concern has proved to be unfounded.
