

# JAGUAR F-TYPE LAUNCH



On Friday 26 to Sunday 28 April, Grange Motors in Brentwood launch the Jaguar F-type. A number of members visited the showroom to see this iconic car in the metal. It truly is a fantastic looking car and all credit to Ian Callum and his design team for creating this Jaguar. However, have they got the pricing wrong? The picture above is of the 5L supercharged V8 with a price tag of virtually £90,000. One hell of a price and one that has a reduced market sales ability I think. Prices for the range start at £58,500 and rising!

What we are aware of is that sometime in the near future a coupe version is on the cards (see picture below). It will be interesting to see what price Jaguar will be asking for this model. Have they priced it right? I believe that there



is around 80,000 expressions of interest in the car. How many will be turned into sales, remains to be seen. I hope it does succeed but I have to ask, had they priced it in the Mercedes SLK, Audi TT and Porsche Boxster segment of the sports car market, how many more orders would they have generated? I suggest a lot more than what they have now. This car has been described as the "true" replacement for the 60's e-type. *Is it?* Will original editions of this car be worth over 40 times it's value or more in 50 years time, as has the E-type? Somehow, I don't think so. The E-type was unique when a claimed 150mph top speed and

0-60 mph in 7.1 seconds was unheard of in cars of that time. Its body was a piece of art. Now this car may get to 60 mph in just over 4 seconds, but there is a lot of other manufacturers' models that can do this or better, as well as having top speeds of over 200mph, where as the F-Type is limited to around 180 mph on certain models. What has this got that makes it stand out then? Yes, it has a lot of technology and it is indicated that it is an out and out sports car rather than a grand tourer, as is the XK but I am not sure it will be as historic as the e-type was. I will not be around to find out!




