

JAGUAR XE Jaguar has announced the name of its new mid-sized saloon - the Jaguar XE - at the Geneva Motor Show. The car is set to offer excellent economy and performance thanks to a hi-tech construction and advanced engines.

Jaguar's vehicle line director for the Jaguar XE, Kevin Stride, said: "The engineering development of the XE has focussed on delivering customers with the most advanced, efficient and refined sports sedan in its class. We are excited about our progress to date and are looking forward to soon being able to demonstrate what we have achieved."

Full details of the car are set to be revealed later this year, with the XE going on sale in 2015. The Jaguar XE name was seen as a logical choice for the new model, which will line-up with the Jaguar XF and Jaguar XJ in the firm's range of saloons.

The new Jaguar XE will fit into the vacant slot left by the Jaguar X Type, which Jaguar stopped building in 2009. The Jaguar XE will get a new look that is much more in keeping with the current line-up, although the car will get its own unique character.

Ian Callum, Jaguar's director of design, said: "The new Jaguar XE is every bit a modern Jaguar; more compact in size but visually striking. Customers will expect a great deal from a mid-size Jaguar - it must be practical but premium. We never forget we are designing a Jaguar and that means it must be as exciting to look at and drive as it is brilliant to run and practical to own. We believe we've done just that with the Jaguar XE."

The Jaguar XE will be tasked with taking on formidable opposition in the form of the BMW 3 Series, Mercedes C-Class and the Audi A4, which means we can expect it to be priced from around £25,000. It is set to get its full reveal at the Paris Motor Show in October, before going on sale

The car will be the first model to use Jaguar's new lightweight aluminium construction, which was showcased on the Jaguar C-X17 concept car. The advanced underpinnings mean the Jaguar should be both stronger and lighter than any of its rivals. The latter will help the baby Jaguar to be extremely economical, quick and fun to drive.

The engines are also said to be cutting edge and, while exact specifications are still a closely guarded secret, Jaguar has confirmed that the engine range will offer extremely low emissions of less than 100g/km and performance of up to 186mph. The car will also be available with either two-wheel drive - for optimum economy - or four-wheel drive, for all-weather grip and stability.

The Jaguar XE will need to offer decent space for four passengers and their luggage – although the car's lightweight construction should allow for a larger cabin, without any weight penalty – and it will also get a premium cabin, with leather and soft-touch plastics.

The Government has confirmed that the demise of the tax disc will coincide with a range of new rules. To clarify, from October 1st 2014 no vehicle will be required to display a disc in its windscreen. Even valid discs that expire (say) in January 2015 will be superfluous. Why the change? Because discs are simply receipts that can be checked by the police to ensure vehicles are taxed. This is no longer necessary as compliance is enforced via a computer-based database. The Government has also revealed that motorists will be able to pay by direct debit annually, six-monthly or monthly. Those that pay by instalments will incur a five percent surcharge and payments will continue until cancelled. However, there will be some people that cannot pay in this manner such as those with first



registration vehicles, in fleet schemes and with HGVs (paying the Road User Levy). And there will be more changes. Motorists that sell cars privately will no longer be entitled to offer the "unexpired tax" incentive that adds value. Why? Because the absence of discs could make it easier for sellers to misrepresent how much tax is remaining. So, sellers will have to claim refunds for remaining months from the DVLA. Buyers will then re-tax online, at post offices, or via the phone before taking to the road.

History Of The Tax Disc In The United Kingdom

The first tax disc appeared in 1921 as a circular piece of paper with a grey background and black markings. More colourful versions followed in 1923 which incorporated a vertical band of (say) green. These discs were not perforated so motorists had to cut them from their surroundings with scissors or craft knifes. Alternatively, some people folded the squares into a round shapes and shoehorned them into their mounts. Perforations followed in 1938 then vanished in 1942. They reappeared in 1952. This gap might have been caused by the destruction of the necessary equipment during World War 2. Furthermore, until this point every disc - irrespective of when it was issued – expired on December 31st. This was a nightmare for the issuers that were inundated with applications over festive periods. Mercifully, from 1961 drivers could pay for a twelve month disc at any point of the year. This coincided with rigorous anti-forging measures that included circular vignettes (designs), bands of colour plus the half-tone background.






