NATIONAL A.G.M. BIRMINGHAM 7 NOVEMBER

Following the normal opening speech at this event, introductions were made of the Directors and club officials as well as apologies for absences. The approval of last year's minutes were confirmed and the adoption of the Financial statements ending 28 February 2015 where discussed by Mike Young. The ongoing claim for the club's investment of £150,00 back in 2010 is still proceeding. It has been to the adjudicator, who has upheld our claim and it has now been passed to the Ombusman for a final decision. The club hopes to receive a reply soon. The case was against our investment advisors - Lighthouse Partners, who are a global investment management firm dedicated to managing alternative investment



portfolios. Other areas of the accounts were discussed, including the increase in membership revenue, (note that this only reflects two months of subscription increases brought in on 1st January 2015), advertising, and club gift sales. A decrease in revenue was experienced from our insurance income. As with each year, our main expenditure is with the production and distribution of the club magazine. The 'floor' consisting of members present at the AGM, agreed to support an increase in the yearly subscriptions by £2, therefore the renewal will be £45:00 from 1st January 2016. Following the accounts, most of the existing directors were re-elected into their current positions. Peter Purdom has been elected to the Chairmanship of the club replacing Rob Jenner who had been undertaking this role, but was duty bound to stand down this coming year. There is a new club award entitled the "JEC Club Spirit Award". There were five nominations for this award including myself**, who was nominated by Peter Davey. However the award went to Carol Robertson, Chairman of South Yorkshire Region and was presented by Martyn Raybould of Footman James Insurance Brokers.

Following lunch, we had our regional representatives' meeting whereby we had a presentation from Ray Searles - JEC Events Coordinator, who presented those present with a 12 page colour newsletter showing the events planned for 2016. This was followed by a presentation from Keith Vincent regarding changes made by the DVLA as a result of the closure of all regional DVLA offices. Certain areas of the work undertaken by the DVLA has now been transferred to Classic Car Clubs of which the JEC is one of those. Finally, Tony Ridge discussed the changes that are to be implemented in the club logo and stationary as a result of Jaguar Cars copyright of the Jaguar leaper logo and name. They are actively pursuing companies that use the logo and name in their advertising without permission. The club has been granted permission to use the Jaguar "old" wings logo. Changes to the logo will mean the colour green will in future be a solid colour with no shading and under the logo will be the statement, "Sharing the passion". The font text too will be changed.

are welcome for possibly the largest New Year's Day gathering in the South East at Brooklands Museum.



Gates open at 9am and the Museum buildings and displays are open from 10am - 4pm; normal Museum admission prices apply which is:



NEC CLASSIC CAR SHOW

The 2015 National Classic Car Show at the NEC was again a complete success. A variety of car clubs were on display along with a section for motorcycles. Some of the exhibits were astounding and there were some really unique cars, including some prototypes from years gone by. The Saturday Silverstone Auctions vehicles were on display prior to the auction and I was privileged to get on the stand and amongst the cars. A Jenson P66 prototype won 'Car of the Show' award.



As ever, there were a number of Jaguars on display throughout the 5 halls of the exhibition centre. One that caught my eye was a late XK150 "barn find" which was on the Twyford Moors - The XK specialist from Clanfield, Hampshire, had on display on their stand. They hope to restore it to its former glory.

"JEC Club Spirit Award"

As you may have read on page 3 in the AGM summary, there was a new club award entitled the "JEC Club Spirit Award". Back in September of this year, a request was made by the national club for nominations for the **Footman James / Jaguar Enthusiasts' Club** annual "Spirit Award". The trophy is presented annually to the member that has worked tirelessly, often behind the scenes to assist the JEC to become the Club it is. There were five nominations for this award. Essex Thameside Region member, Peter Davey, put me forward. As you would have read, I was considered, but in the end, the Award went to Carol Robertson, Chairman of South Yorkshire Region. However, Peter has asked that his letter to the national club be published for you all to read. I feel humble that such a fine letter was submitted for me to be considered for this award. Below and overleaf is the letter submitted by Peter addressed to Vince Franklin, the JEC Co-ordinator.

Dear Vince

Re: Nomination for the Footman James/Jaguar Enthusiasts Club 'Spirit of the Club Award – 2015 – Mr. Doug Warren, Chairman of the JEC Essex Thameside Region

Introduction

As a fully paid up member of the Essex Thameside Region, Membership Number: 34686 and a former CEO of a PLC who doesn't often come across such professionalism and dedication to a club I would like to nominate our Chairman, Doug Warren, of the JEC Essex Thameside Region for the Footman James / Jaguar Enthusiasts' Club 'Spirit of the Club' Annual Award 2015.

His Background

Doug joined the Jaguar Essex Thameside Region in the spring of 2006 and his membership number is 65482. His first Jaguar, which he bought in September 2005, was a dark blue 2.5L 4 wheel drive X- Type with ivory leather interior. His current car is a Seafrost XK8 4.2 Convertible which was a present for his 60th birthday in January 2013.

Doug became the Newsletter Editor soon after he joined in October 2006. He has made this into one of the most professional forms of communication which goes out every month to all of our Membership and Sponsors either by email or post. Doug has been able to secure sponsorship from 7 companies who recognise the quality of the Newsletter see link:

Doug became Chairman of the club in November 2010 and retained his responsibilities as Editor at his own request. Under his Chairmanship the fully paid up member numbers have increased from 70 to 128, an increase of 83%, and there is now far more member participation at events. He is respected by both his Committee members, who offer him great support, and other members who help with setting up stands and moving kit to the venues.

His Commitment to the Club

In spite of Doug working full time, until recently, he spends at least 8 hours each week on Jaguar business and obviously as some months are busier than others this can easily stretch to 16 hours as he works tirelessly to make every event as near perfect as he can for the members. In addition he has regular dialogue with the Treasurer and Membership Secretary as well as calls and queries from members.

He spends hours planning out stands by having all model types together, including painting the lines for each cars slot on the day which has to be parked at the exact angle he wants to make the maximum impact for the club display and organising people to help set up at various shows. There are also display boards in the gazebo showing members cars and club member application forms and he signed an additional 8 members at Battlesbridge in September.

Going the Extra Mile (to Europe)

He has also organised trips to Europe, Leuven in 2013 and Deauville in 2015. As an example of how Doug 'goes the extra mile' for the club for the 4 day break to Deauville in June this year he not only booked the travel and hotel but also arranged the restaurant for the first night (including getting everyone's meal choices). He also designed and ordered rally plates and organised parking and display at Hornfleur. Doug also produced a file for each car with itinerary, things you must have, maps and screen shots of roads so drivers could see what the junctions etc. looked like so no one would get lost if they were parted from the group. He is already planning another trip to Reims next June and already has 20 members signed up to go.

He also personally arranges all 20 of the outings each year for the club and he attends 99% of them (only his holiday stops him going). He has a particularly good relationship with Grange Motors in Brentwood who have provided new launch cars for our shows. He has also persuaded them to donate raffle prizes to members in the form of an F type Jaguar for the weekend, what an incentive to make money for the club, you can't get a better prize than that. Every month he personally buys raffle prizes for the monthly meeting, which he Chairs at Langdon Hills Golf Club in Essex.

Summary

In summary Doug is a consummate professional in his role as Chairman of the club who is respected by all of our members. In spite of being the Chair since 2010 he is still able to be innovative and comes up with new ideas for every show to make us the 'best in show' which in turn helps to encourage members to attend more of the events and we are all proud of the club's achievements under his stewardship. He is a true ambassador for the brand.


up to auction, through H&H Auctions, at the Imperial War Museum Duxford on October 14th 2015.
