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FTYPE



Between the 29 September to 14 October 2012 at the Paris Motor Show, a new star was born in the shape of the Jaguar F Type convertible. Deliveries of this new 'mean' machine began in the UK from 2013, nearly 4 years ago. At the time there were three engine variants, a 340 PS V6, a 380 PS V6 and a 495 PS V8. Prices started from £58,520 for the 340PS V6 and as much as £80,000 for the V8 5 litre supercharged model. In 2014, the Coupe version was launched with the same power packs but starting prices were cheaper at £51,250 for the 340 PS V6. Only one 'special' edition has been made called "Project 7", which was limited to a run of 250 cars with a 5 litre supercharged V8 engine developing 575 PS. Worldwide sales of the F Type were slow with only 6,377 models sold in 2013, but increased with the introduction of the coupe in 2014 and 2015 with worldwide sales of 11,506 and 11,662 respectively. The "Project 7" is already a collectors' item and second hand models are selling well over the initial asking price of £130,000. One is currently available at £180,000! A good investment for just 3 years. Now Jaguar has decided to update the F Type for the 2017 MY and made slight changes to the car, including making a 'special edition' F Type 400 Sports. This will be a limited edition run for the 2017 model year and not beyond. Costing £70,115 for the coupe or £75,600 for the convertible, both are fitted with a new 3 litre V6 400 PS engine, capable of 0 - 60 in 4.8 secs and a top speed of 171 mph. Grange Motors and Beadles of Southend are awaiting your orders.

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2016 - A GREAT YEAR FOR JLR

Jaguar Land Rover's global sales broke half a million in 2016; a year-on-year growth of 13% compared with 2015.

Individually, Land Rover's sales grew by 8% to 427,122, while Jaguar experienced a 77% boon; rising from 94,449 in 2015 to 148,730 across 2016.

The rise coincides with 2016 being a recordbreaking year of UK car registrations, with almost 2.7million registered, compared with 2.6million in 2015.

Europe made up the largest chunk of sales, with 138,695 cars finding owners and a 26% rise over last year, while Jaguar's China and North America sales grew by 31% and 25%, respectively.

The UK remains Jaguar Land Rover's most

promising market, however; in the UK, we bought 117,571 JLR cars in 2016 and made the year the most successful yet in the company's history in this country and abroad.

Sales were undoubtedly bolstered by Jaguar's first offering into the booming SUV market; the F-Pace. Jaguar shifted 45,973 across the year, despite Jaguar waiting until the spring to put it on sale.

Proving the strength of the SUV market was also the Land Rover Discovery Sport; Land Rover's best-selling model

of 2016 and occupying the same market as the F-Pace. 122,460 were sold across the year, while the Range Rover Evoque and Range Rover Sport



made up 200,245 sales between them. Sales of the Land Rover Discovery trailed off



slightly last year, according to Jaguar Land Rover, as the market prepares to welcome the new model later this year.





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
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One of our members, Mario Varnava, has recently ventured into a detailing business based near Stapleford Abbotts. He has a four bay premises off Bournebridge Lane, RM4 1LU.



He completed a number of projects before Christmas, including a couple of Range Rovers, which as he put it were very filthy. Mario prices for detailing depends on the car, condition, and requirement. He uses the best ph neutral products available. One of his recommended products is Swissvax. What so special about these products? While conventional car waxes have a carnauba content of between 3 and 5%, Swissvax formulations contain between 30 and 76% by volume (one of the highest concentrations available on the market). Unlike ordinary polishes, which simply polish a paint surface to a shine while the lower layers of paint get dryer and "starve", the Swissvax carnauba formulations, enriched with passion fruit, orange, avocado and vanilla oils, restore a deep shine to the paintwork. The result is a deeper,

unique "wet look" that so appeals to collectors and car enthusiasts the world over.

Switzerland's reputation for quality and precision is reflected in their products. For over three generations, Swissvax have been committed car lovers and collectors. Their unique products do not have to meet either sales targets or production budget constraints. This has allowed Swissvax to become what it stands for today: high-value care by perfectionists for perfectionists. The waxes are only one part of the process that Mario uses. He power washes the car initially before he washes it again using snow foam and leaves it to penetrate the dirt before washing it off. He then uses special sprays that assists with the removal of dirt and film before moving on to more detailed work using various polishes and compounds. This process is determined by the condition of the car's bodywork.

While at the premises after Christmas, a client arrived wanting his car detailed by Mario. He was driving a Ferrari 358 Spider.






The car looked immaculate, but on closer inspection under artificial lights blemishes could be seen, which Mario was confident he could make the car more show presentable.



Mario also had a 1958 Ford Anglia 100E which required some work. This was a special Ford because the verified mileage on the car was just 6,349 and because it has a two pedal Newtondrive clutchless manual transmission. This was introduced in 1957 but dropped in 1958! Once completed it will be up for sale at around £6,500. Mario not only undertakes detailing but paintless dent repairs big or small, leather interior refurbishment, headlamp correction, paintwork scratch removal and correction, alloy wheel refurbishment and general all round valeting and cleaning both on the premises and mobile. Mario also carries out Ceramic Coating and waxing.

There are two types of wax used to protect your vehicle's paint as well as bring out it's true shining potential:

Spray wax and hard wax.

Spray wax is easier to apply evenly to a vehicle's exterior. It is a great way to quickly bring out your vehicle's true shining potential inbetween heavy wax jobs, meaning your vehicle should always have at least a base of a hard wax to protect your paint.

Hard wax takes a bit longer to apply than spray wax, but lasts longer and provides better protection, especially during those harsh summer and winter months. The general rule of thumb is to hard wax your vehicle every three months while using spray wax in-



between to maintain protection and shine. If you drive your vehicle in many harsh conditions (heavy rain, snow, ice, hot days, etc.) it is also common practice to receive a hard wax around every 3 months. Wax has been a staple in the automotive community for many years to protect paint and reveal a brighter shine.

Ceramic Coatings

Within the past couple of years, a new option for paint protection has become available in the form of ceramic coatings. Over time, wax will break down and require more coatings (about every 3 months). Ceramic is not a paint protection, wax or sealant that will wash away or break down over time. Scientifically speaking, it is a nanoceramic coating that forms a permanent adhesion to the paint and can only be removed through abrasion – NO chemical can dissolve the coating. The coat will stay hard for a lifetime if maintained correctly. This permanent adhesion protects



against scratches, UV rays, corrosion, heat, and more – not to mention the extreme gloss that it provides! Many come with a LIFETIME WARRANTY, because it's that good.

PAUL ARNOLD'S JOURNEY WITH HIS JAGUAR XKS-C

I bought my Jaguar XJS Convertible on my birthday in November 2015 after being tipped off by a golfing friend of my wife.

The car had been laid up in a garage on the fringes of Epping Forest and was covered in piles of rubbish and a generous helping of thick dust. It was first registered January 1985 and its past owner had transferred it to an Irish number plate. The car had not been driven for a good 10 years and had been passed down as part of an inheritance. I was extremely excited when the current owner agreed to sell it for a very good price

and I was able to get it home.

The boot lid badge indicated that it was an XJS-C but further examination and a visit to look at a real one owned by club member, Steve & Helen Clark, told me something quite different.

I investigated the history of the vehicle in closer detail and realised the car started its life as a Coupe, but had been altered into a Convertible in 1996. Going back through all the history I had been given with the car and there was a lot - I managed to make contact with the guy who had the conversion carried out.

He owned my 3.6 manual Coupe together with another XJS and had both cars converted into fully folding

convertibles but still retaining the central roof strengthener, although now fully trimmed. The very professional conversion was carried out by a company called *Kent Elms Coachworks* based in Southend. Sadly, I found that this company had gone out of business many years ago, but I discovered that apparently the company carried out a total of 6 such conversions. I had the pleasure of seeing another one at the Battlesbridge Show during the summer of 2016. Obviously, I'd be very interested to find out if the other four still exist. Does any member know?

Its been a long, at times, frustrating journey since I bought the car, but finally now - and to cut another very long story short - my converted coupe now has a fresh MOT. A major brake, clutch, wiring and fuel system overhaul has been carried out by a long term friend in the trade, and it is finally looking like I might be able to give it a nice clean-up and take it out and drive it in the very near future. My current plan is to run the car over spring and summer to iron out any further mechanical issues, as well as reregistering it with the original number plate..

All is going well at the moment, the next step will be to attend to the bodywork and trim over next winter, so much to a journey... Paul Arnold JEC Essex Thameside member.
