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Russell "Two Jags"

Member Russell Smedley sent me this picture of his wonderful X350 parked adjacent to another Jaguar - SEPECAT Jaguar fighter plane at the Eastland Meadows Country Park in Bradwell-on-Sea. A military history enthusiast who created his own museum has taken delivery of this fighter jet. James Harvard, who runs the park, created the museum out of memorabilia he has collected in the last 20 years. He said: "The restoration is expected to take 18 months, with monthly maintenance thereafter. It is a benchmark in one's life that makes it all worthwhile, with the bonus of being able to share our British heritage with all who



have a feel for the same interest." The museum, featuring guns, medals, uniforms and coins, now runs out of the clubhouse at the park and is open to the public at the weekends.

Mr Harvard added: "Last weekend we conducted a survey regarding other Military Museums, in Essex, regarding the numbers of military uniforms on display, from that study I'm happy to say that we have the largest collection on display in Essex, surpassing even RAF Duxford.

"We have approximately a further 180 uniforms in storage ready to display as development progresses." Mr Harvard, who is also restoring a Mark 8 Lynx helicopter, hopes to be able to open the museum for school visits in the future and continue to develop the museum and his collection.



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Jaguar may have been slow to enter the SUV market, but its first effort, the F-Pace, has since taken more than half of the brand's sales. Like most late bloomers, then, it's keen to make up for lost time, with this smaller Jaguar E-Pace the first of three additional SUVs on the way.

The E-Pace will cost from £28,500 when it goes on sale later this year, which means it will go head to head with the likes of the Audi Q3, BMW X1 and Mercedes-Benz GLA. However, while those cars closely resemble the bigger SUVs in their respective ranges, the designers of the E-Pace have been bolder, taking their inspiration from Jaguar's F-Type sports car. This can be seen in headlights that stretch back into the bonnet and side windows that taper to a point over the car's muscular haunches. And yet none of this looks out of place in the way that sports car details traditionally have done when applied to SUVs. The decision to not just create a Mini-Me version of the F-Pace breaks from recent Jaguar form; even the brand's design director, Ian Callum, admits that $\underline{\text{the } XE}$ and \underline{XF} executive saloons look similar.

Callum puts this down to the need to build brand awareness, but he says: "Now that Jaguars are becoming a more familiar sight on the road, we are going to separate the cars more. Only the rectangular front grille has to remain consistent."

In total, 3.2 million new SUVs were registered across the continent, meaning that for the first time in the history of the auto industry this type of car was the most popular amongst European buyers. 22.5 per cent of all cars sold last year were SUVs, meaning that hatchbacks and superminis are no longer leading the market in terms of sales. However, in the UK, the Nissan Qashqai is the biggest selling SUV to date, ranking 4th in the current sales charts (as at June 2017) with 33,474 models sold. On this basis Jaguar will be on a roll with their new E-Pace, as they are with the F-Pace.

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BEADLES GROUP

Beadles Group, which operates 12 car dealerships **including a Jaguar and Land Rover site in Essex**, has been taken over by Group 1 Automotive. The Group, ranked 10th in the latest Automotive Online (AM)100 listing of the UK's largest dealer groups, is set to climb further up the table with a major acquisition. Group 1 announced its takeover of £294 million turnover Beadles Group to US investors. This, when added to Group 1's £1.5 billion existing business, will see the UK motor retail business overtake TrustFord in the UK rankings.

The acquisition, which was completed on Friday 30th June 2017, and will give Group 1 its first Volkswagen, Toyota, Kia and Vauxhall operations, and expand its current representation of Jaguar Land Rover and Skoda. It will now have 43 dealerships in the UK.

Earl Hesterberg (pictured), US-based Group 1's president and chief executive, was appointed the director of Beadles Group on July 1.

"The Beadles Group is a great fit for Group 1, as we further expand our footprint and brand portfolio in the UK. Beadles was established in 1893 and incorporated in 1915 and has an outstanding reputation for customer service and satisfaction. This acquisition bolsters our scale, provides additional management resources, and introduces new brand partnerships in the UK. We are also pleased to grow our existing relationships with key brand partners," said Hesterberg.



Following a recent visit to Beadles Southend, Glenn Napper, Head of Business at Beadles Jaguar Land Rover, indicated it was going to be exciting times for the Group not only from the takeover but also that

work has started on their new premises at Aviation Way, Southend which is hoped to be completed by July 2018.

Some members of JEC Essex Thameside Region visited the Shuttleworth Collection on Sunday 16th July. Having first met up at North Weald airfield for coffee and buns, we made our way up the M11 and across to the A1 for Bedfordshire to visit The

Shuttleworth Collection. This is an aeronautical and automotive museum located at the <u>Old Warden Aerodrome</u>, <u>Old Warden</u> in <u>Bedfordshire</u>. It is one of the most prestigious in the world due to the variety of old and well-preserved aircraft.

The collection was founded in 1928 by aviator Richard Ormonde Shuttleworth. While flying a 'Fairey Battle' aircraft at night on 2 August 1940, Shuttleworth fatally crashed. His mother, in 1944, formed the Richard Ormonde Shuttleworth Remembrance Trust "for the teaching of the science and practice of aviation and of afforestation and agriculture." Restoration and maintenance work is carried out by a staff of nine full-time and many volunteer engineers. These volunteers are all members of the 3,000-strong Shuttleworth Veteran Aeroplane Society (SVAS). These dedicated enthusiasts are crucial to the preservation and restoration of the collection.

In addition to the aircraft, the collection houses a number of vintage and veteran cars. Events include model-flying days, and once a year, there is a special flying day for schools in the area.

The Shuttleworth Collection puts an emphasis on restoring as many aircraft as possible to flying condition, inline with the founder's original intention. There are typically about twelve air shows per year, including evening displays, which offer the opportunity to see aircraft which in many cases are the last of their type to survive, let alone existing in flyable condition.

Some of the most notable aircraft in the collection are the five Edwardian aeroplanes, of which one is the oldest

British aeroplane still in flying condition. What makes these exceptional is that they still fly (weather permitting). The oldest, with British civil registration G-AANG, is the Bleriot XI (still with original engine), which dates back to 1909 - six years after the Wright brothers' aircraft and the world's oldest airworthy aeroplane, the next oldest being, at only three weeks newer by date of manufacture, the Old Rhinebeck Aerodrome's own restored original Bleriot XI (Bleriot factory serial number 56, with civil registration N60094) in the United States.

Adjacent to the aerodrome that houses the Collection is the Swiss Garden. An outstanding example of the Regency fashion for creating landscapes in a picturesque alpine style.

It is a peaceful, tranquil space, and one which has new vistas revealed at every turn. Within the garden are 13 listed structures, an adjacent woodland sculpture trail and three resident peacocks. A good time was had by all members who visited Shuttleworth and we finished up at The Green Man pub at Stanford for a brilliant late lunch.

JEC ESSEX THAMESIDE VISITING BLETCHLEY PARK ON SUNDAY 10th SEPTEMBER

Bletchley Park is a place of exceptional historical importance.

It remains highly relevant to our lives today and for the future. It is the home of British codebreaking and a birthplace of modern information technology. It played a major role in World War Two, producing secret intelligence which had a direct and profound influence on the outcome of the conflict.

Over the past twenty years Bletchley Park has become an internationally renowned site, visited by people from around the world, which acknowledges the successes from the War and the people responsible for them. It celebrates their values: broad-minded patriotism; commitment; discipline; technological excellence. By presenting and explaining these achievements and these values, in the very place where they occurred, Bletchley Park brings together the dramatic history of the twentieth century with the challenges we face in the twenty first in our rapidly changing and technologically complex society.

Bletchley Park holds internationally significant collections

The collection held at Bletchley Park focuses on items relating to the wartime story of Bletchley Park, with particular focus on codebreaking activities and the Codebreakers. As much of the evidence of codebreaking activity was destroyed after World War Two, the objects and documents that remain are of international significance.

The Trust's own collections include personal items from Veterans, such as diaries, letters and recollections, and oral histories that add a unique personal insight into the wartime codebreaking activities. In addition, Bletchley Park is a repository for objects and documents on long-term loan from GCHQ's historical collection. These include many of the key items that relate to the codebreaking story, such as relevant cipher machines and original paperwork.

The archaeology of the site, and the still existing buildings, are classed as heritage assets and are also a formal part of the collection. They stand as striking evidence to the work and life of the Codebreakers and the evolution of the 'intelligence factory' that developed during World War Two.
