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# Jaguar XJ8 V8 1997- 2002 versions.



As the owner of a nice low mileage 1999 Jaguar XJ8 3.2L V8 I thought I would look back in time at what other cars of similar size, engine and luxury were available at the time of this cars release. What other cars were there in competition to the Jaguar?

As I have copies of "What Car – Car of the Year Award" magazines going back to the early eighties, I thought I would look and see what was said about the car.

Featured in the 1998 magazine, the XJ8 V8 3.2L was awarded the 'Luxury Car of the Year Award' beating the BMW 735i and Lexus LS400 models. The magazine stated they were looking for: "The last word in comfort, refinement, ability prestige and opulence. We wanted effortless power and reassuringly good security, too. In short, the best that money can buy without costing the earth."

The Jaguar XJ8 3.2L met the challenge against the BMW & Lexus. The basic XJ8 3.2L was the 'Sport' model at £34,480 + £750 for metallic paint. The next model was the XJ8 3.2L. This was priced at £35,680 + £750 for metallic paint again. The difference mainly was that the Sport had cloth seats as standard (although leather upgrade was available at £1,065) and the XJ8 had leather seats as standard.

The BMW 735i was priced at £43,710 including metallic paint and the Lexus LS400 was £49,975.

So, the XJ8 was a competitive buy at the time. The 'What Car' magazine said in their 'Judges' Notes' that; "the international launch of the XJ8 was that Jaguar had

learned many lessons from the previous car. As a result, the new V8 was a BMW 7-series beater...

A 1,000 mile comparison with an Audi A8 2.8 and a BMW 728i revealed that the Jag outpointed them both on almost every count. And the Jaguar bigger brother, the 4.0L, duplicated the feat several months later, claiming the scalps of the Lexus LS400, the BMW 740i and the Mercedes S320. But the award goes to the Jag 3.2L because you will rarely miss the bigger engine's performance, though you'll appreciate the £5,300 saving and the lower running costs of the smaller engine car."

Going forward one year to the '1999 Luxury Car of the Year Award 'and the Jaguar was pipped at the post by the 'new' Mercedes S320. The Jaguar was still 'Highly Commended' but a point to note was that the Mercedes had a price tag of £50,340, whereas the Jaguar 3.2L V8 was still only £36,405, a difference of nearly £14,000!!! The Luxury Car Award went to the Mercedes S320 for the following years, until 2004. with the Jaguar XJ8 4.0L getting the Highly Commended Award for the next three years. Interesting to note that from 2004,5 & 6, the Jaguar XJ6 (X350 model) received the Luxury Car of the Year accolade, beating the Mercedes S320. Jaguar always fought back and were competitive in their pricing and standard equipment.

This is where, Jaguar owners are benefiting, there are many 1997-2002~XJ8's V8 3.2L & 4.0L engine cars available and are a great investment. Really low mileage cars are attracting prices between £10,000 to £15,000 or like me, they can be had for as little as £300, but expect to spend much more doing it up! They really are a great ride.

To sum up, as 'What Car' states in its commendation of the Jaguar XJ8, "...the most telling change is that the purrs and pulses emerging from beneath the bonnet are closer to the best from Munich or Tokyo than anything we've been used to from Coventry."

At less than £36,000 it's awesome value, too. The directors of BMW, Mercedes-Benz, Audi and Lexus must be beating the walls in frustration.
















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

# How to change the Orange Front Side Markers to White Side Markers on a Jaguar XJ8 - X300/308

I usually like to keep my cars factory specification, or at least to a spec that was available from the factory. One exception I have made is on my XJ8 (X308) 4.0 litre Sovereign. On this model the side marker lights were always orange from the factory. I have converted my side markers to white lights, with chrome bulbs WY5W 12v 5w (available for under £7 a pair). As we know Jaguar have used various parts on different models. In this case the two XJ8 interior boot lights which are of course white, can be altered to become side white light markers. These can be purchased from Ebay for a reasonable price.



To make the boot light fit you need to remove part of the plastic. The clips either end of the light can be cut off with a junior hacksaw and the plastic edge smoothed with a file.

This conversation is the same for the X300 and X308 XJ models.



You will need to remove the two metals retaining clips from the orange side markers. These come off easy enough with gentle persuasion with a small screwdriver. Just push the clips onto your new white side marker. Swap the orange bulb to the amber ones. Fit the white markers in the wings, and as they say on Wheeler Dealers, 'Job done'.



It is a personal preference which colour side markers you think suits best, but I reckon the white ones, suit the car and make it look more modern.
