for the time and Fairmont currently have more recent classics in the showroom, since they sell better during the winter whilst the older models do better in the summer months.

There was a comprehensive selection of such cars to view in the two-storey showroom, with more parked in the warehouse opposite. One of the vehicles in the latter was a yellow Jensen Interceptor restored and sold by club member Martin Saward – small world! David told us that he has taken deposits from two separate buyers but they have not turned up to collect, so it is still on sale. Yours for £42,995.

A Morning at Fairmont

As members will know, Ian Croxson had arranged a breakfast meeting at Fairmont Sports and Classics, based in Hutton, Brentwood. The winter weather performed well and was bright, dry and a little chilly, so excellent conditions for a morning's gathering. Other members must have felt the same, for it was a well-attended event with several of our lady members also enjoying the morning.

Owned by David Scarborough, Fairmont Sports and Classics was opened just around lockdown in 2020 with twelve staff, but officially shut down only a week later. However, they were still able to trade via the internet behind closed doors. In fact, Covid provided a boost to the classic car market with people having cash on hand but nowhere to go and spend it. David informed us that fast Fords particularly benefitted with many younger people buying, unseen, cars that had once adorned their bedroom walls on posters when they were younger. Having sold over 70 vehicles during this time, only one buyer returned his purchase. This was a Chevrolet Corvette, the only fault being that it was too small for the large purchaser to fit in it.

The classic car business has recently been hit by the rise in interest rates but, as people have adapted to these new rates, sales have started to recover as prices for many cars have reduced, particularly at the high end. Interestingly, he tells us that the increase in use of automatics and the onset of electric vehicles has increased demand for manual cars.

Selling successfully is all about having the right stock

He does buy what he likes, as well as what makes other enthusiasts happy, which is why the first floor has a few Subarus for sale including a rare S201 Impreza which, apart from being the ugliest (David's description) car for sale, is one of the most expensive. He admits to Mustangs, E-Types and Lexus as being some of his favourites. Most of the stock is within the £20K-£60K price range with Jaguar F-Types, Mustangs, Aston Martins and BMWs mixing with older cars like the Alfa Romeo GTV6 2.5, the GTV Coupe, Daimler SP250, Datsun 240Z, Fiat 124 Spider and many more.

In the showroom entrance next to possibly the oldest car present – a Morris 8 2.0 Special – sat a beautifully restored 1959 Ford Consul 375 Deluxe in Kenilworth Blue. Probably the best example around today and one which has received the most hits on the website. That kind of restoration would cost many thousands, but it could be yours for £34.5k.

I can't sign off without mentioning another showroom standout – a classic 60s/70s jukebox. But this was one with a difference for, instead of playing the old vinyl singles, it had CDs in the rack. As David explained, he has a large collection of CDs and this was the ideal location for them to be seen and heard – the music is piped around the building. The jukebox was not as old as it appeared, though; in fact it was new and had been built to order. They cost around £5,000 if you are interested.

After a great morning, it was time to go, but I'll leave you with a few photos taken during our visit.


